The manuscript is typed double spaced throughout on one side only on 22×28 cm (8½×11") opaque white bond paper with 3 cm margins all around.	Only units of measurement and mathematical formulas and calculations are abbreviated and they follow the form recommended in <i>Uniform Requirements for Manuscripts Submitted to Biomedical Journals (Br Heart J</i> 1984; 51: 1-6).  Appropriate headings and subheadings are provided.
The manuscript is arranged as follows: (1) title page, (2) summary, (3) text, (4) references (5) legends, (6) tables. Pages are numbered consecutively, beginning with the title page as page 1.  The last name of the first author is typed at the top right corner of each page.	<ul> <li>□ Every reference, figure, and table is cited in the text in numerical order.
