

VACANCY: CARDIOLOGY IN FOCUS SECTION EDITOR

Heart, published by BMJ and co-owned with the British Cardiovascular Society, has an exciting vacancy for an enthusiastic Editor to lead the journal's Cardiology in Focus section.

Heart is an international peer reviewed journal that keeps cardiologists up to date with important research advances in cardiovascular disease. Education in Heart articles provide a comprehensive, continuously updated, cardiology curriculum. The journal promotes active interchange among researchers and readers to come together as a community to advance science and improve patient care via regular free audio podcasts, letters to the Editor, and news via Twitter and Facebook. The Cardiology in Focus section consists of short articles on topics of interest to trainees and junior cardiologists (as well as more senior ones). Topics might include career advice, interviews with researchers or leaders in the field, tips on publishing, how to interview for an academic or clinical position, how to keep up with the medical literature, challenges faced at different career stages, issues related to women in cardiology etc.

The journal is seeking an enthusiastic cardiology trainee or junior cardiologist to commission and write relevant articles for this section. They will be responsible for identifying topics of interest, inviting potential authors to contribute, reviewing and editing the content (as needed), and participating in the journal's editorial processes. Each Cardiology in Focus article can be up to 1500 words in length with a flexible format in terms of style, figures, tables and online supplements.

The Cardiology in Focus Editor will report directly to the journal's Editor-in-Chief, and will be invited to participate in occasional editorial meetings. The initial term will be for one year, with possible renewal for an additional year upon mutual agreement. This is an unpaid position.
